**REPORT OF CLEANLINESS DRIVE CONDUCTED BY FACULTY OF

REPORT

On 14th November, 2025 the Department of Accountancy, Department of Business Management and Department of Banking/Finance of Morigaon College (Autonomous) organised a Cleanliness Drive in the ecological site of Morakolong, Morigaon. The event was held with the help of B.Com 1st Semester, 3rd Semester and 5th Semester and the teachers of Faculty of Commerce, Morigaon College (Autonomous).

Objectives for the program:

1. Remove pollution caused by human activity in the ecological site of Morakolong, Morigaon.
2. Motivate the students to care more about preserving the environment.
3. Create awareness about pollution and its adverse impact on plants and animals.

A program was conducted by the students and teachers of Faculty of Commerce, Morigaon College (Autonomous) in the ecological site of Morakolong in Morigaon on 14th of November at 4.00 PM. The event was conducted in light if the damage caused by human activity and fostering a culture of conservation among the youth. The primary focus of the project was the physical removal of pollutants, specifically non-biodegradable waste and plastic debris that had accumulated along the banks and within the water body. Through a coordinated cleanup drive involving local volunteers and sanitation experts, significant strides were made in restoring the natural habitat. By removing these physical stressors, we have allowed the local



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ecosystem a chance to breathe and begin its natural recovery process, ensuring that the water quality and soil health are preserved for the future.

Parallel to the physical restoration, a robust educational campaign was launched to motivate students to take an active role in environmental stewardship. Recognizing that sustainable change starts with the next generation, the initiative engaged students through hands-on activities and interactive storytelling. By highlighting the beauty and biodiversity of their own backyard in Morigaon, the program instilled a sense of pride and responsibility. Students were encouraged to see themselves not just as observers of nature, but as its primary guardians. This emotional connection is vital for ensuring that the cleanup efforts are not a one-time event, but the start of a lifelong commitment to preserving the environment.

Finally, the project addressed the urgent need for awareness regarding the adverse impacts of pollution on the region's flora and fauna. Detailed workshops and visual presentations were used to demonstrate how chemical runoff and plastic waste disrupt the life cycles of local plants and endanger aquatic species. By illustrating the "domino effect"—where the decline of one species leads to the collapse of an entire food chain—participants gained a deeper understanding of the biological stakes involved. This newfound awareness has empowered the community to identify harmful practices and advocate for the protection of Morakolong's unique biodiversity, ensuring that both plants and animals can thrive in a pollutant-free environment.

OUTCOME:

The recent event at Morakolong was a major success, resulting in a much cleaner and healthier environment for the local community. By working together, we successfully cleared large amounts of plastic waste and litter that were harming the area, instantly improving the beauty and safety of this ecological site. This hands-on cleanup showed everyone that immediate action can lead to visible, positive changes in our surroundings.

Beyond the physical cleaning, the event sparked a new sense of energy among the local students. Many young participants expressed a deep commitment to protecting Morakolong, moving from being passive observers to active "eco-warriors." Through simple demonstrations and discussions, they learned exactly how pollution poisons the water for fish and stunts the growth of native plants. By the end of the day, the community walked away with a clearer understanding of how their daily habits affect nature, creating a long-term



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culture of awareness that will help keep Morakolong vibrant and pollution-free for years to come.
