OBJECTIVES OF THE EVENT: Aims to provide firsthand experience in research, promote deep engagement with studied communities and foster critical skill essential to the discipline.

TOTAL PARTICIPANT: 70 numbers of students of both Major & Minor course participated in the event. Students were accompanied by Two guide Teachers

DETAILS OF THE EVENTS: DETAILS OF THE EVENTS: The project aimed to understand the socio-demographic characteristics of the Tiwa community of Manipur Village in Morigaon district, Assam. As Anthropology emphasizes the holistic study of human populations, this field-based project allowed students to apply classroom knowledge to real community settings. The fieldwork was conducted on **10 th November 2025** to 13th November 2025 and undertaken by **5th -semester students** enrolled in the *paper foundations of Anthropology*. During the field visit, students collected essential demographic information such as age, sex, educational level, occupation and marital status. They also documented cultural dimensions related to kinship, marriage practices and traditional health beliefs. Findings indicate that the population of Manipur Village reflects features of a **transitional society**—marked by rising literacy and growing social awareness, yet challenged by youth out-migration, low household income and continued dependence on agriculture. Despite these changes, the Tiwa community maintains strong cultural traditions, which continue to shape social structure and everyday life. Overall, the population study offered valuable insights into the demographic and cultural landscape of Manipur Village and helped students

appreciate the interconnected biological, social and cultural aspects that define human populations.

OUTCOME OF THE EVENT: Students gain hands-on experience in applying anthropological research tools such as participant observation, interviews, case studies, genealogies, schedules, and mapping. They learn how to collect primary data systematically and ethically within real-life social settings.
