1. INTRODUCTION

MORIGAON COLLEGE

Morigaon College, established on 1, July, 1964, is the oldest institution of higher education in Morigaon district, Assam. It has witnessed 60 years of perseverance, academic excellence and growth as one of the premier institutions nurturing and disseminating higher education in the region.

The college is located in the eastern part of the Morigaon town— headquarters of Morigaon district. It is 70 kms away from Dispur, the state capital of Assam. The nearest railway station is Jagiroad (23kms) and nearest airport is LGBI airport, Borjhar, Guwahati (96 kms).

Since its inception, the college imparted education in the Arts stream for the first two decades. Science stream was introduced in 1985 for facilitating a congenial environment towards pursuing higher education in science and cultivating scientific temperament. In 2002 the college introduced several vocational and job-oriented courses like Computer Applications, Industrial Fish and Fisheries and Functional Hindi. In 2012, Commerce Stream at degree level was introduced to fulfill the need of higher education in Commerce for its aspirants. This fulfilled the long felt absence of an academic centre for higher education in Commerce in the whole region. Career-oriented courses like Functional English, Translation and Proficiency and Entrepreneurship in Small Scale Industries were started in the academic session 2004-05.

The college earned the pride of introducing Postgraduate Programme in Geography in 2017 and Zoology in 2018. At the U.G. level, Sociology (General Course) was introduced in the same year. Post graduate programme in Assamese, English, Political Science and Commerce is being introduced from 2026 along with postgraduate diploma course in Computer Application. The Chemistry Laboratory of Morigaon College was recognized by Gauhati University as highly capable of facilitating advanced research works. Besides, in 2020, the college introduced Bachelor of Computer Applications and Food Processing (Agri).

In the face of the current socio-economic scenario, the UGC has reoriented and reshaped its policies and programmes to make the Indian higher education system career-oriented with a focus on quality and excellence. It is in keeping with the spirit of UGC that Morigaon College under the directives of the Government of Assam has implemented NEP 2020 from the academic session 2023-24. The professionally qualified graduates with solid knowledge on the core disciplines and enterprises are expected to have better chances for recruitment in service, industry, self-employment and allied sectors.

2. THE GOVERNING BODY

The Governing Body (GB) is the apex body of the College in overseeing its operations, setting policies and ensuring the functioning of the College in alignment with its vision and mission. The members of the GB are drawn from diverse sectors including academicians,

administrators, industry expert, alumni and community representatives. The GB has a pivotal role to play in the overall growth and development of the College. Discretionary powers are vested upon the Governing Body and the Principal of the college controls and undertakes the responsibility for the maintenance of standards of education, interdepartmental coordination, examination, research, and infrastructure development. The Principal is assisted by the Vice Principal, the teaching and non-teaching staff for smooth running of the administration.

5. Infrastructure for Administration, Academics and Research

The College has two administrative blocks; fourteen (14) well structured buildings with ramp facilities; sixty two (62) well ventilated classrooms; thirty two (32) ICT enabled classrooms; four (04) Conference cum Seminar Halls , namely, Akhil Kumar Gohain Conference Hall (AKG), Pradip Kumar Saikia Conference Hall (PKS), Dr. Himangsu Sarmah Memorial Conference Hall (HSM), and New Conference Hall (NCH); seventeen (17) laboratories; a research laboratory; a language laboratory; and four (04) computer laboratories for conducting classes, organizing seminars/conferences/workshops and carrying out research works. Additionally there is an Open Classroom for conducting extramural classes.

There are two (02) offices of the Principal in separate buildings in the campus; an office each, of the Vice-Principal, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), the Examination Control Committee, and Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) — Morigaon College Study Centre. There is a Teachers' Common Room and nineteen (19) departmental common rooms for the faculty of the college. There are separate office rooms for NCC, NSS, and Morigaon College Students' Union (MCSU). There are five (05) gates for entries and exits at different spots in the campus.

New Campus: 70 bighas of land at Kasomari Kishan, adjacent to the Morigaon Polytechnique College campus has been allotted to Morigaon College in 2025.

6. Library and Reading facilities

Gurucharan Medhi Library:

The Central library, namely, Gurucharan Medhi Library is named after the founder Principal of the College. It is an RFID based fully automated library using SOUL 3.0 software. The library has a total collection of 44,320 books including text books and references; 18 Journals/Magazines and 8 Newspapers. Additionally, the library provides access to 6000 e-journals and 1, 99,500 e-books under N-LIST subscription.

There is a separate 'E-Resource cum Internet Browsing Section' for use of students.

Book Bank facility is offered to the needy students.

Reprography facility is available at a nominal price.

Departmental Library:

In addition to the Central Library, every department has its separate library facility for reading and borrowing of books by faculty and students.

Open Library:

There are two Open Libraries in the college aimed at encouraging and inculcating reading habit among the students. The resources of the open libraries are made accessible to the students without the hassles of any formal procedure. Such resources are available only for reading purpose.

7. Facilities for Games and Sports

Playground:

The college boasts of an expansive playground with an area of 13,560 (120x113) square meter, with facilities for football, cricket, kho-kho, athletics, javelin throw, discus throw, high jump, long jump, volley ball and basketball.

Indoor Stadium:

The Indoor Stadium cum Multipurpose Hall has provisions of two badminton courts, one volleyball court, 10-meter shooting range with two Rifles and two pistols, Arm wrestling table, table tennis boards, chess and carom boards. Yoga training sessions are conducted on regular basis.

Gymnasium:

The gymnasium is well equipped with tread mill for cardiovascular exercises; dumb bells, bar bells, leg press, chest press *et al* for strength training. The gymnasium has provisions for weight lifting, power lifting and bodybuilding.

8. Canteen Facilities

College Canteen:

The college has a well furnished canteen with seating capacity of 80. There is a separate air conditioned room for use of faculty and guests. The canteen caters to the standards of cleanliness and hygiene with reasonable prices against its menu.

Cafeteria:

The cafeteria provides a quick snack to the teachers and students who have little time to spare in between classes.

9. Students' Accommodation Facilities

Swahid Giribala Deka Girls' Hostel:

Swahid Giribala Deka Girls' Hostel has been functioning since the year 2000. It has seat capacity for 100 boarders.

SC Girls' Hostel:

SC Girls' Hostel was set up for the girls' students belonging to SC category in the year 2019 and has been functioning since. It has seat capacity of 30 boarders.

Swahid Mudra Patar Boys' Hostel:

Swahid Mudra Patar Boys' Hostel was set up in 1980 and has a capacity of 25 boarders.

10. Health Care facilities

- **Sick Room:**
There is a two bedded sickroom for use by students, teachers and staff during imminent conditions. It offers basic medical care, first aid and treatment for minor illnesses or injuries.
- **Day Care Centre:**
The day care centre provides child care services for faculty and staff.
- **Drinking Water Station:**
The college has four drinking water stations with water purifiers and water coolers for use of students. Additionally, there are 13 water purifiers in different locations within the campus.
There are separate water coolers & purifiers in the hostels for use of hostel boarders.
- **Ambulance:**
There is an Ambulance facility to meet any situation arising out of an emergency. It provides medical transportation and care to students, faculty and staff in moments of crises. This facility can also be availed by people of the community as and when deemed necessary by making a minimal payment to the college.
- **First Aid Facility:**
First aid facility is available for tending to minor injuries and illnesses.
- **Sanitary Pad Vending Machines:**
There are two sanitary pad vending machines for the convenience of the girl students. These vending machines provide sanitary pads at a nominal rate.

11. Facilities for Cultural Activities

- **Dr. Bhupen Hazarika Open Air Stage:**
This was set up in the year 2016 under the aegis of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University, Morigaon College Study Centre. It provides ample space for organizing and hosting cultural events, performances and plays.
- **Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Speakers' Corner:**
It offers a platform for holding discussions, debates, lectures and exchange of ideas.
- **Auditorium:**
The Auditorium has a seat capacity of 1200 and is equipped with acoustic sound system and motorized drop screen that facilitates the performance of various cultural events.

- **Musical Instruments & Costumes:**

There are five guitars, five pairs of tablas, five harmoniums, one violin, one Drum set, one *Dhol* and a pair of taals. Costumes are available in the college for Bhaona and Satriya dance performances.

12. Pro-Environment Initiatives

- **Laboratory Waste Water Treatment Units:**

The Department of Chemistry, Morigaon College has set up three units for laboratory waste water treatment. As a part of its commitment to environmental sustainability and safe laboratory practices, these units are designed to treat chemical effluence generated from laboratory experiments and practical sessions, ensuring that hazardous substances are neutralized or removed before disposal.

- **Air Quality Monitoring Station:**

The Air Quality Monitoring Station is set up under National Air Quality Monitoring Programme (NAMP) financed by the Central Pollution Control Board. Currently, the monitoring station is under the supervision of the Department of Chemistry in collaboration with Pollution Control Board, Assam. The air quality parameters under study are PM 10, PM 2.5, NO₂ and SO₂.

- **Larvivorous Fish Tanks**

For controlling mosquito borne diseases viz. malaria, dengue in the campus, there are four larvivorous fish tanks for breeding of Guppy fish *Gambusia affinis*. These small freshwater fish feed on mosquito larvae making them a natural form of mosquito control. This is an environment friendly alternative to chemical pesticides.

- **Rain Water Harvesting:**

There are two tanks for harvesting of rain water, which is later used for non potable purposes in the campus.

- **Green House:**

The Green House was set up in the year 2007-08 by Anti Global Warming Society, Morigaon – a local NGO. It is a noble step towards protecting the degrading environmental conditions. It aims at motivating the students and the local populace in creating environmental awareness.

- **Campus Pond:**

It is a step towards conservation of local bio-diversity by creating a natural habitat for supporting birds, fishes and other aquatic species.

- **Campus Bio-diversity Register:**

It is a comprehensive data base that documents and tracks the various plant and animal species found on campus. It is attempted at encouraging student involvement in bio-diversity conservation and research.

For encouraging awareness among the students, the trees in the campus are provided with QR codes, disclosing valuable information pertaining to their medicinal and commercial uses.

- **Solar Panels**

The solar panels are used in the campus as a sustainable source of power for building and lighting.

13. Self Sustenance Measures and Skill Development Initiatives

- **Live stock Rearing:**

Dairy farming and Goat farming in the campus provide an avenue for skill development as well as revenue generations by selling off fresh animal products. It gives an opportunity to the students to learn about economic sustainability through animal husbandry.

- **Vermicompost Unit:**

The initiative of producing vermicompost enables sustainable agricultural practices in the campus. This unit is jointly maintained by the Departments of Chemistry and Botany. The bio-fertiliser produced by this unit is packaged and marketed.

- **Horticulture Farm:**

The horticulture farm covering an area of 0.311 acres grows jujube, lemons, banana, litchi, mango, dragon fruit, guava, through organic farming and aids in revenue generation.

- **Duckery:**

The Duckery was started as a part of the 'Earn when you Learn' initiative of the Department of Zoology. This has been functioning since 2021, aimed at giving ten ducklings each to the economically challenged students for learning the rearing process and receiving economic benefits.

- **Cutting and Tailoring Centre:**

This centre is committed at making the students economically self sufficient by providing hands on training and practical experience in designing, cutting and sewing garments using various fabrics and techniques.

- **Weaving Centre:**

The weaving centre is an innovative and hands on learning space preserving the Assamese traditional art of weaving *gamosa*, *rumal* and *chador-mekhela*. The products are marketed while the student trainees are imparted valuable lessons in skill development

15. Infrastructure and Facilities for Recreation

Boys' Common Room:

The Boys' Common Room is designed for relaxation and recreation of the students with seating arrangements and a recreational corner.

Girls' Common Rooms:

There are two Girls' Common Rooms in the college for use of the girl students. These rooms are well furnished with furniture, washrooms and drinking water facilities. There is a recreational corner in each of the common room with provisions for indoor games viz. carom, ludo and chess.

Teachers' Common Room:

The Teachers' Common Room is a space designed adequately for providing the faculty members for engaging in discussions in matters related to the academic and administrative affairs of the college. Located conveniently within the main building, the room is furnished with comfortable seating and basic amenities like LCD television, water purifier, fans and newspapers. This is a much a coveted common space for holding discussions with teachers across disciplines.

NCC:

Nagaon, under the Directorate of NCC, Shillong, the unit is open to both male and female cadets.

NSS:

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit, of Morigaon College plays a pivotal role in fostering community engagement and social responsibility among the students. Notably, the NSS unit has conducted flood relief camps, providing essential aid to the affected communities; cleanliness drives under “Swacchta hi Sewa” programme, thereby instilling a sense of civic duty and volunteerism among the students of the college.

Adopted Villages:

As a part of its commitment to community outreach and social responsibility, the College has adopted eight villages under the “Unnat Bharat Abhiyan” (UBA), a flagship programme of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, aimed at connecting Institutions of Higher Education with local communities to address developmental challenges. 24. RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

College Uniform: Boys must be dressed in white shirt and black formal pant. Close fitting & low waist/ mid-rise/ low-rise pants will not be considered. Shirts/pants must be of appropriate length neither too long nor short. The dress code for girls is blue *salwar*, white *kameez* and blue *dupatta*. Short fitting dress & leggings/pants will not be considered. Only maroon coloured blazer or cardigan during winter for both boys and girls is recommended. Jacket, jeans and T-shirts are not a part of the dress code. A college logo (which shall be supplied by college authority during admission period) has to be affixed by each student on shirt pocket position (for boys) and right sleeve of the *kameez* (for girls). All students must maintain the dress code of the college. No student shall be allowed to attend classes, festivals or any functions without proper uniform.

Rules concerning student conduct: Each student is required to attend allotted lectures, tutorials, and practical classes. Use of mobile phone by students is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Exhibition or introduction of any political party-emblem in the college premises is forbidden. Disciplinary action will be taken against a student resorting to such acts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against any student resorting to acts calculated to cause public nuisance, disturbance of public peace, law and order. Any of the following acts by students shall be considered as a major breach of discipline: (a) Habitual unpunctuality, (b) Any form of immoral behaviour, (c) Use of intoxicants, drugs etc. in the college premises or in any of the attached hostels. (d) Resorting to violence of any kind.

Anti-Ragging: Ragging is strictly prohibited in the College premises as per UGC rules and regulations. Morigaon College has an Anti-ragging Committee for looking into matters leading to ragging related offenses (if any) and taking punitive actions as deemed necessary.

Library Rules: Gurucharan Medhi Library is kept open from 9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. throughout the year on all working days except on Sundays and holidays. Membership of the library is open to the students, teachers and non-teaching staff of the college. Newly admitted students need to fill up a library membership form and submit it along with two copies of recent passport sized coloured photograph. Students can issue/ return books themselves in the 'Self Service Kiosk' automatically with the RFID library card.

**25. Revised Academic Regulations of Assam State Secondary Education Board
(ASSEB), 2026
for
Higher Secondary Students**

In exercise of powers conferred under section 30 read with section 30.2(B) of the Assam State School Education Act, 2024, the ASSEB, Division-II for imparting Secondary Education (Class XI & XII), in Assam, formulates the following regulations for defining the Scheme of Studies of Higher Secondary Courses along with the conduct of the activities relating to Admission, Registration and Examination. These regulations shall come into force with effect from the 2025-26 Academic Sessions for both the Regular Courses of ASSEB

HIGHLIGHTS

Key Points

- The Secondary Education (Class XI & XII) shall comprise of three streams viz. Arts, Science and Commerce.
- The Vocational Stream has been replaced by Skill Subjects w.e.f. the academic session 2026-2027.
- The subjects offered under the Vocational Stream will be offered as Skill Subjects in integration of Academic Elective as per guideline of NEP-2020.
- Any student after having passed the Class 10th examination from ASSEB Div-I or any other recognized boards of Govt. of India as well as Govt. of Assam may take admission in the HS Course.

CHANGE OF SUBJECTS/STREAM

- Students are to opt for those subjects in Class XI which they would like to continue in Class XII and are available in the school/college at the time of admission.
- However, to address some unwarranted issues (such as medical/ any exigencies) or if the student is not capable of coping with the subject(s) etc., the request for change of subject(s) in Class XI & XII will be accepted provided such a request has been made before 31st October for Class XI and 15th July for Class XII of that particular academic session.

- The H.S. Final Examination as well as H.S. First Year Annual Examination will be conducted by the ASSEB Div-II at the Govt./Provincialised Institutions in consultation with the Lead College of the District and Inspector of Schools.
- The result of the H.S. Final Examination will be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in H.S. Final Examination only.
- No credit of HS 1st Year examination shall be counted towards the result of H.S. Final Examination.
- The H. S. Final Examination shall be held in the month of February-March.
- Internal Examinations shall be conducted by the Institutions for the students of H. S. 1st Year and 2nd Year classes.
- ASSEB, Div-II will conduct Repeat (Betterment) and Compartmental Examination etc. maximum within 3 months after declaration of the H.S. Final Examination results.
- The Board will conduct the Final Examination of HS First Year every year.

PERCENTAGE OF ATTENDANCE

- Any student who has prosecuted a regular course of study either in the H.S. 1st Year or in the 2nd Year class may be admitted to the H.S. First Year Examination or to the H. S. Final Examination in the appropriate stream as a regular candidate provided, he/she attended 75% of the classes held in each subject.

THE SCHEME OF STUDY FOR HIGHER SECONDARY STAGE

- There will be 6 compulsory subjects in total for all students.
- Subjects to be taken in each stream are divided in groups namely A, B, & C.
- A candidate shall opt for all the Core subjects listed under part A and Elective subjects listed in Part B & C as specified.
- Each candidate has to opt for 4[Four] elective subjects compulsorily. These elective subjects will be of 100 marks, with or without practical.

- In addition to the 4 [Four] elective subjects, a candidate shall have to compulsorily study Environmental Education in Class XI and General Studies in Class XII for 50 marks each. The assessment of the subjects will be done internally (Institution where studying) and Grade will be awarded.

PASSING CRITERIA

PASS MARKS FOR H.S.1st YEAR EXAMINATION

- In the H.S.1st Year Examination, a candidate has to pass in both the MCQ type part and descriptive type part of the subject separately with 33% of marks as well as in the practical/project portion and theoretical portion of the subjects, with compulsorily 33% of marks separately.
- ASSEB will issue instructions to Internal Examination Committee to prepare 4[Four] sets of OMR for selected subjects to conduct the examinations. The list of selected subjects shall be notified from time to time.
- After completion of the evaluation of the scripts and online posting of marks of Annual Examination of Class XI, ASSEB will declare the result and e-Marks Sheet will be issued to the students.

PASS MARKS FOR H.S. FINAL YEAR EXAMINATION

- The minimum pass marks is 33% of the total mark for all subjects.
- For a subject having practical/project parts the minimum pass marks shall be 33% of the marks allocated to the theory part and 33% of the marks allocated to the practical/project part.
- In H.S. course curricula, the student must appear in 6 [six] subjects and the result will be declared as PASS, only if the students will secure 33% of marks in aggregate, in spite of the fact that even if he fails in one subject. However, passing in English and MIL/Alt. English is compulsory.

PLEASE NOTE THAT

- As a candidate has opted for 6 subjects, the decision to determine the best 5 subjects may be taken by the admitting institution/employer. Further, it is informed that the ASSEB does not calculate/declare/ inform percentage of marks. If the percentage of marks is required for higher education or in employment, the calculation, if any, may be done by admitting institution or employer.
- ASSEB Div-II will award subject-wise grades to the candidates in class XI from the academic year 2025-26 & in Class XII Final Examinations from the academic year 2026-27 along with the marks secured by them in each subject. The awarded grades shall be reflected in the Mark-sheet cum Certificate issued to the candidates of class XI & XII as mentioned above.
- In skill based subject(s), the ratio of practical and theoretical part will be 50:50.

EXAMINATION –REPEAT (BETTERMENT)

- Passed out students can appear in the Repeat (Betterment) Examination only once and in the subsequent examination.
- Candidate can appear in the Repeat/Compartmental examinations in any one of the subjects which he/ she has selected in the previous Regular examination only.
- If any candidate appears in Repeat (betterment) exam, then his/her result of Repeat exam will only be retained and the result of his/ her previous examination will be nullified.
- In Repeat (Betterment) and Compartmental Exam, every candidate has to bear the Fees. Subject wise fees will be applicable in case of such examinations.
- The students appearing in the Revised Betterment of Result Scheme need not to appear in Practical/Project Examination if subject(s) contains Practical/Project. The original mark obtained for the above shall be considered for the fresh mark sheet.

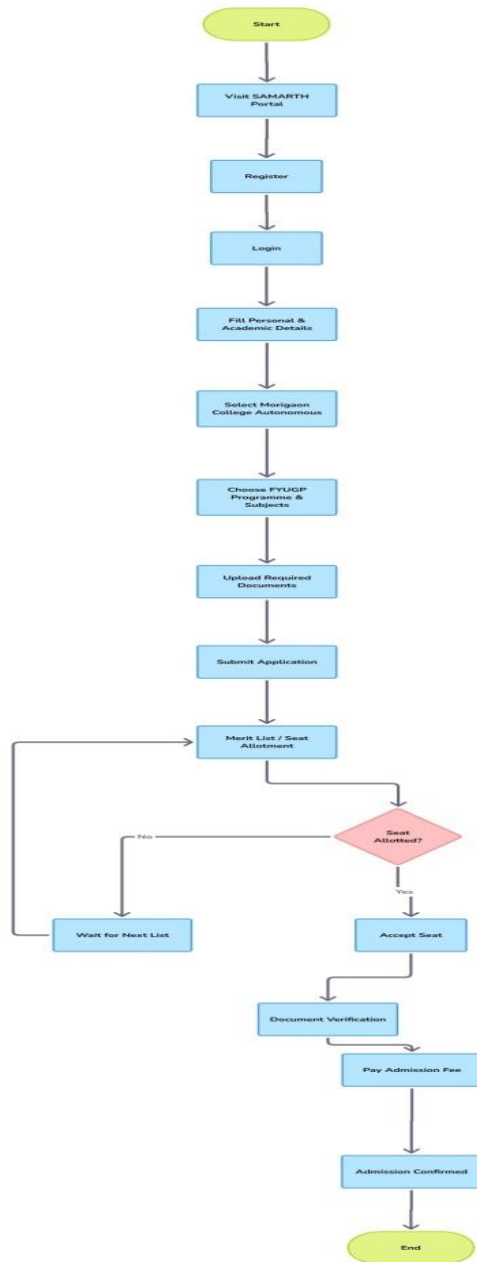

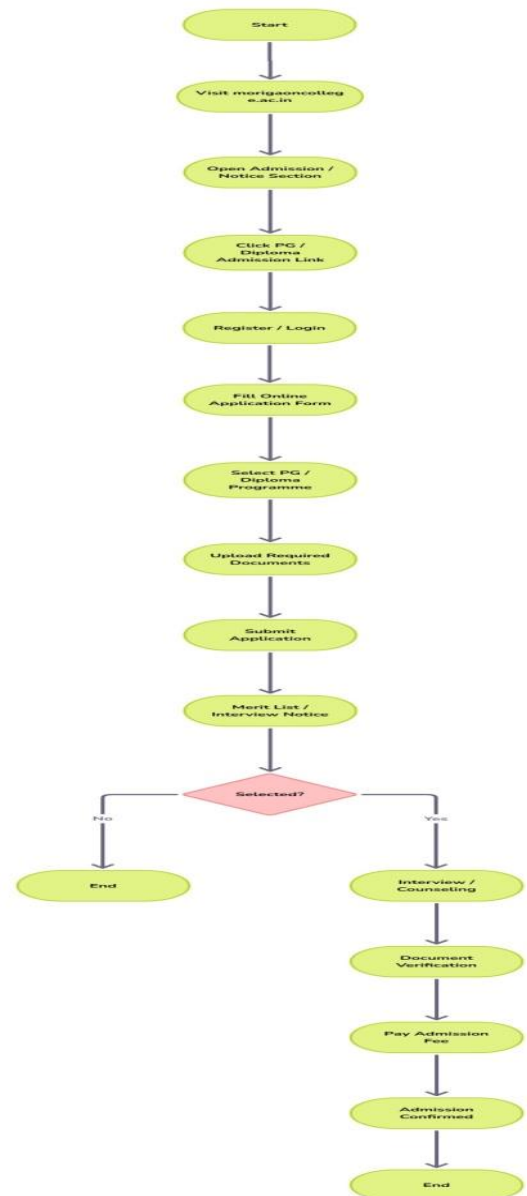

30. Admission Guidelines

Eligibility and Document Verification

Eligibility shall be verified as per:

- Gauhati University norms (where applicable)
- UGC and NEP 2020
- Institutional academic regulations

Admission shall remain provisional until final document verification.

Subject Combination

- Subject combinations must conform to approved programme structures and NEP 2020 credit distribution.
- Final approval rests with the concerned department and the Admission Committee.

Seat Capacity

- Intake capacity shall be determined based on statutory approvals and availability of infrastructure and faculty.
- Seat allotment shall be merit-based and category-wise.

Subject Change

Subject change shall be permitted only:

- Within the notified timeline
- Subject to seat availability
- With departmental and committee approval

Multiple Entry and Exit

- The College implements Multiple Entry and Exit provisions under NEP 2020.
- Award of Certificate, Diploma, or Degree shall be based on earned credits and ABC norms.

Special Courses

Separate regulations apply to certificate, diploma, PGDM, and self-financed or skill-based programs. Admission criteria and fees shall be notified separately on college website, admission portal and notice bulletin.

Hostel Admission Policy

Hostel admission is independent of academic admission and subject to separate application, eligibility, and seat availability.

Allotment is based on:

- Merit
- Distance from residence
- Socio-economic background
- Availability of seats

The Hostel Management Committee shall oversee selection, allotment, and discipline.

Major (Honours) Selection Policy

- Selection to Major (Honours) subjects shall be strictly merit-based, subject to eligibility, departmental cut-offs, and seat availability.
- Departments recommend candidates; final approval rests with the Admission Committee.
- Final lists shall be published and documented for audit and compliance.

Anti-Ragging Policy

- The College enforces zero tolerance towards ragging in accordance with UGC Anti-Ragging Regulations.
- Submission of student and parent anti-ragging affidavits is mandatory.
- Violations shall invite strict disciplinary action, including expulsion and legal proceedings where applicable.

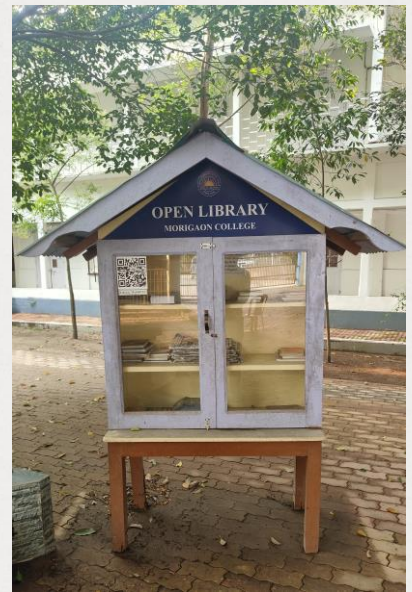
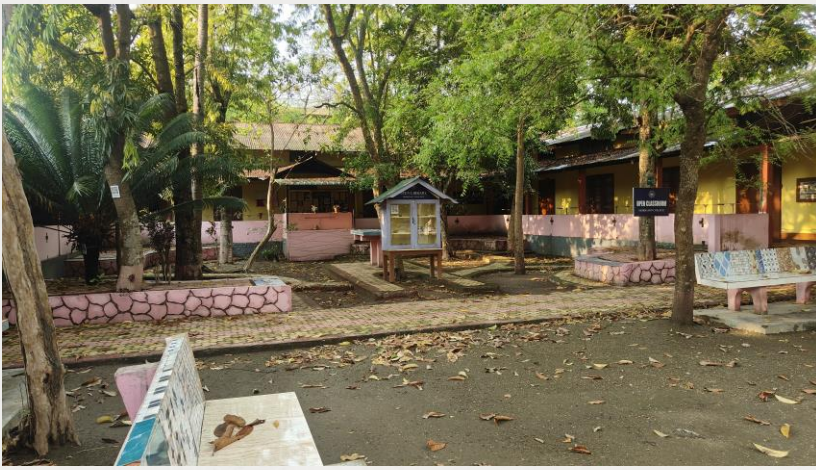
